As to Revolutionary Records, I am sure that Mrs. Clayton Grant, my cousin of Wilmington, N. C. joined th DAR on the basis of the service of William Brantly, Senior. I am/positive of this, but you could look at the DAR Lineage Books and I can also contact Mrs. Grant. She is a great granddaughter of William Brantly, Senior.

William Brantly, Senior, was one of the leading men of Chatham County in his time. He was elected twice to the State Senate, serving in 1804 and 1805. Wheeler's History shows this. He owned much land on Rocky River and raised a fine and distinguished family. I can tell you lots about them, in fact, I have so much about Doctor Wm. T. Brantly that it would take hours to tell. I have a fine picture of Dr. Wm. T. Brantly which you should see sometime.

While we do not have documentary proof, it is about certain that William Brantly, Senior's father was John Brantly, who lived on an adjoining farm. The family originated in Isle of Wight Co., Va. where Edward Brantly land in 1738. From there, they spread out over Halifax Edgecombe, Granville, and other eastern N. C. counties.

The late Jno. L. Morshead, who lived in Charlotte, married a granddaughter of Dr. Wm. T. Brantly, You probably know all about that.
